

Pt. 2 High School Outreach Instructions (How to start a discipleship group and a school Bible club with lunchtime assemblies).

After conducting six consecutive outreaches at the restaurant inviting the students, we should perform the following:

Select a corps of converts or believers who want to be trained on a team to start a discipleship group or an on-campus Bible club. Note that the discipleship group can be held at the restaurant while you're waiting for an on-campus Bible club to form.

Obtain phone numbers of that core and communicate by phone or text message with their parent's permission (ask them to obtain parental permission). Set up leadership training meetings with this core. This could be in place of a regular after-school outreach.

Ensure this corp is studying the Bible, having daily devotions, and getting plugged in with other Christian groups such as a Church. You may want to give them a daily devotional, a book, and a fill-in-the-blank Bible study. Make sure they are studying the Bible.

Explain, to this core, how the Bible says there are two kinds of Christians.

1: There are complacent, lukewarm, and spectators in the church type of Christian and the number.

2: there are the radical world changers Jesus called his followers. He commanded them to become "fishers of men."

There are those Christians on the outer court who know about God and those on the inner court who "KNOW" God. Those who learn to hear God's voice get filled with the Holy Spirit and become world changers. Challenge them with the question, what kind of believer do you want to be?

If they accept the challenge, you tell them that we want them to be a part of the leadership team and what we will do.

Number one, we will launch a Bible club in this high school, put on lunchtime assemblies, and organize weekly Bible studies.

Number two, we will ask you to enroll in a 9-week course where we meet one day a week and learn the eight essential practices to grow as a Christian.

These include:

1. Ask yourself how close you want to be to the Lord.
2. Be committed to being a disciple. (This involves being water baptized).
3. Be committed to Evangelism. (explain that this involves bringing in at least two of their friends).

4. Be committed to prayer and study of the word of God on a daily basis, personally and in group settings.
5. Receive the Baptism of the Holy Spirit and a release in your heavenly language with interpretations.
6. Explain what sin is by practicing daily repentance. (You may want to teach on essential topics, such as" the beauty of moral purity, and keeping yourself for that particular spouse).
7. Thank God for trials and conflicts in life and brothers or sisters born for adversity or conflict. As iron sharpens, iron one will sharpen another. Thank God, as He uses them to surface Blindspot in your nature so he can deliver and heal you.
8. Learn to forgive all those you have ill feelings toward or carry offense toward. Ask forgiveness for every grudge you may be holding.

It might be noted That sometimes it is a good idea to turn this discipleship class over to being taught by a local church youth group leader.

The following are the steps to forming a Bible Club on campus.

(It's essential to know from the beginning that all clubs must be student-run. We are just the coaches by their permission).

If there are two or more dedicated participants, they can move toward establishing a school-sanctioned club.

Step one is for them to find a sponsor. A sponsor can be any school employee. For example, a teacher, a coach, a cafeteria worker, a custodian, an administrator, and so on.

1. They can then go to the principal's office and complete the necessary paperwork. They can then ask for privileges, such as a meeting room at lunch or after school.
 - They can obtain permission and use different means or practices to communicate their meeting as a club. For example, they can print and distribute flyers on or off campus. They can use other social media means, such as Facebook, Messenger, text messaging, etc. They can make announcements through the school intercom and or daily video. They can put invitations and information in the school paper, etc.

We can supply the club with a study manual covering the foundational essential Christian faith practices that are needed to grow spiritually.

The club should start a phone directory of all members and potential members. They can be text messaged for reminders of meetings, Etc.

1. They should elect officers and vote on substantial decisions.
2. The club now has the right to invite outside guests to speak or to teach.
3. The club can now facilitate a lunchtime assembly. They can secure, for example, the auditorium or a large room. They can invite guest speakers and purchase enough pizza to

feed everyone at lunch. We suggest a lunchtime assembly every two months and a weekly club meeting. A meeting could be after school or during lunch. It's essential to tell the club that we, as "Campus Revolution of Love, " will serve them, help set up everything, and pay for everything. We even donate computers, sports equipment, and other prizes.
